Master in International Cooperation and Development (MICD)

1. About MICD

The Mid-Western University under the Faculty of Humanities and Social Science offers MICD- a two-year Master's Programme aiming to develop competent human resources knowledge and effective tools to lead and manage projects in the field with specialized of development cooperation. The Master's Programme is designed to equip learners with academic background and necessary practical knowledge including project management skills required by national and international NGOs, UN agencies, public institutions and other development projects. In response to the need to train students on international cooperation and development, MICD is designed under academic and technical assistance from University of Pavia in Italy within the framework of global Master in Cooperation and Development Network (CDN) of Pavia.

2. Programme objectives

- Train and equip students to achieve the highest professional standards to manage and lead development projects effectively.
- Impart students with academic and practical knowledge and necessary skills to interpret multi-dimensional issues of development interventions, approaches and modalities.
- Prepare skilled professionals in international cooperation and development field required in public institutions, UN agencies, non-governmental organizations and other development projects.

3. MICD Course Structure

The Master's Program aims to familiarize students with various disciplines and development experiences. Spread over two years, the Program is structured into main courses covering Development Studies, Development Economics, International Studies, Contemporary Studies, Management Studies and results based Project Cycle Management. MICD is organized including Project work, Internship and Thesis writing. in four semesters: while the first three semesters are dedicated to front all classes, lecturers and classroom teaching learning activities; the fourth semester is dedicated for acquiring practical knowledge and exposure through project work and internship placement in different agencies followed by thesis writing on development issues. MICD classes are delivered by national and international academicians, experts and practitioners experienced in cooperation and development sector. The Master's Program awards 75 Credits.

Cooperation and Development Network (CDN) of Pavia



CDN is a network of post graduate education programmes in cooperation and development. The first initiative - the Master in Cooperation and Development (MASTER CD) started in Pavia, Italy in 1997 followed by similar other initiatives in Colombia, Palestinian, Nepal and Kenya. All the 5 Master Programmes share same objective of providing academic and practical knowledge to the students to address development

issues and challenges at local and global context.
